Part-time Fee Grant

If you want to get a higher education or professional qualification such as an HNC, HND, or a degree but still want to be able to work, or you just don't want to take on a full-time course, then part-time study might be for you. The money is not a loan – so you don't need to pay it back.

You must be studying 40 Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF) credits or more an academic year. You can choose from higher education courses, Professional Development Awards (PDA), and continuing Professional Development (CPD) courses at SCQF levels 7 – 10. Scottish Vocational Qualifications (SVQs) at level 4 as well as some level 3, are also eligible.

And for academic year 2010 - 11 you can also get up to £500 towards eligible part - time taught postgraduate courses, PDA and CPD courses at SCQF level 11. Scottish Vocational Qualifications (SVQs) at level 5 are also eligible

SVQs

The term Scottish Vocational Qualification (SVQ) means the qualification has been approved by the Qualifications Curriculum Authority. SVQs in Health and Social Care are based on standards set by the Care Sector and are recognised by employers in the UK and abroad. In England and Wales they are known as NVQs. In Scotland the awarding body is the Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA). In England there are a number of different awarding bodies i.e. City and Guilds; Ed Excel; OCR/RSA – but all are assessed in the same way to the same standards.

To gain an SVQ in care you will be assessed in your normal work place performing familiar tasks to the required standards.
